

# Hampton-in-Arden Parish News - Spring 2012

rom an early Easter followed by a continuing cold Spring, your Parish Council have some important items of news to impart especially on HS2 and the effects on the village of the Localism Act – this, as well as some items of particular interest - please read on!

## THE LOCALISM ACT, NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING AND HOUSING

Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council (SMBC), in its Local Development Framework (LDF), has identified several development sites to meet its central Government set target of 11,000 new homes in the Borough, by 2028; In Hampton-in-Arden they have identified the following site for appropriate development:

• The Meriden Road Depot and adjacent land off Lapwing Drive planned for **110** homes (including 40% affordable) – the land would not be released before **2023**; the site currently used by Arden Wood Shavings would be reclaimed and added to the adjacent wildlife area.

Your Parish Council considers this to be an over intensive use of this site and has called for a significant reduction of planned homes and

density whilst also retaining the principle of affordable homes being available to Hampton residents and family members.

During the course of the next twelve months your Parish Council will be developing a **Hampton-in-Arden Neighbourhood Plan** which will identify sites which we wish to protect from inappropriate housing/commercial development.

In close co-operation with **The George Fentham Trust** your Parish Council is committed to the provision of **affordable homes** for local people; suitable sites and funding is being actively persued – the intention is that these homes should be available, in perpetuity, for local people with a proven housing need.

We will continue to keep you fully up-to-date on these very important issues.

### **HIGH SPEED RAIL**

Your Parish Council will continue to oppose this development (the appropriate Bill will be presented to Parliament in 2014/15) whilst seeking to ensure the best possible mitigation measures during the construction phase should the scheme go ahead; we shall also be seeking assurances which will protect our village and the fragile ecosystem of the Blythe Valley; this will be via:

- local forums of Hampton, Berkswell and Balsall Common
- Solihull High Speed Rail Consultative Committee
- Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council (officers and elected members), and
- Caroline Spelman, MP

### Our concerns include:

- road and footpath closures, diversions and temporary restrictions
- safe access to all private properties, businesses, farms and farmland, animals environmental sites

- the effect of extra traffic and noise
- the lack of any **environmental impact assessment** (yet to start with a report in 2013)
- householder and business compensation (including that for relocation and environmental damage such as waste and compaction of soil)

### We are also concerned about:

- the effects of the new Interchange Station on the Green Belt, and
- the pressure to develop the 'Meriden Gap'

We shall continue to keep you fully informed.

### **TELEPHONE BOX**



## **SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL**

Solihull Council have now approved a School Crossing Patrol for Hampton-in-Arden which would be positioned across Marsh Lane from the Beeches car park; this should reduce traffic flows along Fentham Road with, we hope, parents feeling more comfortable to safely walk their children to school – in time we may even develop what is known as a 'Walking Bus'. We are currently seeking the necessary funding.
