

Hampton-in-Arden Parish News - February 2018

HELLO AGAIN

Spring is just around the corner... the daffodils are nearly ready to bloom and we're sure that everyone is looking forward to some warmer weather! In this edition of the Newsletter we provide updates on crime in the village, our road safety and traffic calming plans and the potential changes to the Parish boundary to include the whole of Catherine-de-Barnes. AIRPORT UPDATE

Consultation on the proposed changes to the take-off routes from Runway 33 to the north ended on 16th November 2017. The airport company is now preparing its formal submission to the Civil Aviation Authority which is expected to take several months.

It is envisaged that the Airport Consultative Committee will consider its response to the Night Flying Policy Review at its meeting in February after which the proposals will be submitted to Solihull MBC for a decision.

RECREATION GROUND CAR PARK - NEW BARRIERS

any will have noticed that height restricting Msecurity barriers have now been erected at the entrance to the Recreation Ground car park. Whilst being highly visible and not very pleasing to look at the barriers are considered to be a necessity in helping prevent unauthorised access to the car park (and the green space beyond), a problem which occurred many times in parts of the Borough during last year.

In the near future work will be carried out to the drainage system to prevent flooding of the car park during heavy and prolonged rainfall (which occurred, yet again, in January). When the drainage works have been completed the number of disabled parking bays near to the main entrance will be reduced, an additional disabled bay provided at the far end of the car park near to the scout and guide hut and the parking space white lines will be remarked.

CRIME IN THE PARISH – AN UPDATE

We are pleased to report that there has been a very positive response to the appeal made in the last Newsletter for volunteers to join the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme and assist with Community Speed Watch. A number of residents have offered their services and an initial meeting with the Neighbourhood Policing Team and the small number of current Coordinators took place on 5th February. Residents will be contacted by the new volunteers if their road is to be included, to explain how the scheme operates and what they can do to help in the fight against crime.

There is, unfortunately, a further delay in the reintroduction of Speed Watch due to police resources but it is hoped that this will happen shortly.

ROAD SAFETY AND TRAFFIC CALMING IN THE VILLAGE

We have submitted an updated Road Safety and Traffic Calming Report to Solihull MBC Highways. We met with Ward Councillors and Officers on 1st February 2018 to discuss this Report and agree a way forward. The updated Report is available for view on the Parish website with Meriden Road identified as the priority area. We are hopeful than funding for this priority area will be found either locally or through the HS2 Road Safety Fund. Solihull MBC will receive approximately £2.5 million as their share of this fund for works within the Borough and we actively seek a proportion of this fund for Hampton. We will keep you updated on progress but if you have any comments in the meantime, please contact the Parish Council or Councillor Ken Blanch.



HS2 - AN UPDATE

Except for the environmental and geological surveys currently being carried out not a lot is happening with HS2 in Hampton-in-Arden at the moment. Some residents may have received letters from HS2 demanding access to their property for these surveys. Whilst this round of letters are better in tone than the last round, they could still be felt as

intimidating. The Parish Council will once again be putting in a complaint to HS2 about these letters, but if you are unsure as to your rights please contact the Parish Council and someone will contact you to provide advice and support.



PARISH BOUNDARY REVIEW (AKA COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW) - AN UPDATE

Reference, Solihull MBC received 80 responses and 90% supported the proposal. In the event that the Review is ultimately successful in achieving the Parish Council boundary extension, the whole of Catherine-de-Barnes will become part of an enlarged Hampton-in-Arden Parish.

Solihull MBC have now prepared draft proposals which were presented to and approved by the Governance Committee on the 18th January 2018. A new consultation was launched on 31st January. This new consultation takes the form of three questions/proposals. **These three questions are shown on the last page of the Newsletter. You can fill in this form and email or post it back to Solihull MBC.**

Solihull MBC and the Parish Council are keen for the outcome of this Review to encompass the broadly held views of the residents of the affected areas. If you have a clear interest in this review or are impacted by its outcome as a resident, Solihull MBC would like to hear your views and invite submissions and comments in response to the questions posed by the deadline of 15th April 2018.

We are still looking for adults to join our team, from occasional helpers to section assistants to section Leaders. If you feel you are able to help and would like to join in





- Stories and Painting Held on a Friday afternoon (1.45pm to 2.15pm) every fortnight: February 2nd /


- 16th, March 2nd / 16th, April 13th / 27th and May 11th / 25th.

PLANNING NEWS

- Motorway Services (MSA): We understand no decision on this proposal will be made until March 2018 at the earliest. However, many of you will have signed Caroline Spelman's petition which asks the Secretary of State to reject the application on traffic safety grounds.
- **Affordable Homes:** A development of nine affordable homes in Marsh Lane, managed by the Fentham Trust for those with a local connection, has been approved by Solihull MBC. An application by a private developer for 13 affordable homes on land adjacent 40 Old Station Road is at time of press still awaiting determination by Solihull MBC. Both sites are on Green Belt land and require determination as 'rural exception sites'.
- Hampton Manor: Solihull MBC has approved a new facilities wing and ten bedrooms at Hampton Manor. The extension at the rear of the building is sympathetically designed. We have received reassurance that all works and lorries will access via Shadowbrook Lane and will not use High Street/ Meriden Road.
- M42 Junction 6 Relief Road: Many of you will know that this new dual carriageway will cross land from the M42 beneath Solihull Road to the Clock junction. Highways England have held a number of village consultations on detail yet to be determined. The Parish Council has expressed particular concern about the design of both the north and south junctions. We will keep you updated of any new information about this scheme.

BROWN RECYCLING BINS - IS YOURS SPLIT?

We are aware that many brown bins in the village have split. Solihull MBC have informed us that there was a manufacturing fault with the original bins and this has resulting in many of the bins splitting down the sides. As such Solihull MBC will replace them free of charge.
