NEWS FROM YOUR RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION

Pedestrian safety

Many of you might recall that SMBC announced, earlier in the year, that funds had been allocated for the installation of a pedestrian crossing. We have been made aware that this is likely to be situated towards the Boat car park entrance end of the Village Hall frontage. Solihull MBC will be undertaking a speeding traffic survey to establish the speed of the traffic in the area of the future crossing and the results will dictate whether a zebra or a puffin crossing is constructed. The work is likely to be undertaken in the next month or so.

Village Hall

During the construction of the off- loading area in the village hall it was necessary to take out a number of trees including a large laurel and a holly tree. With these trees removed the Trustees discovered that a number of trees behind the outbuilding were in various stages of decay. A survey was undertaken which has confirmed the trees were in a dangerous state and needed to be removed. This work was undertaken during the end of September and the Trustees take this opportunity to apologise to the local residents for the noise created during the chipping operation.

P<u>lanning</u>

Solihull Local Plan – Examination

Two inspectors have been appointed to examine the Plan at the enquiry which starts on the 27th September at 9.30am. The timetable for the various sessions will be available on our website shortly. I'm afraid at the time of going to press we are not in receipt of instructions as to how to watch virtually but when these are available details will be put on the website. There are 2 sessions likely to be of local interest and they are Wednesday morning 10th November when Housing site allocations in Hampton in Arden are being discussed and Thursday morning 11th November when Solihull housing sites (including SO1 – for the 700 +homes on Lugtrout Lane/Damson Parkway) -both commence at 9.30am.

Motorway Service Area at Catherine de Barnes

This enquiry starts 12th October and is likely to last 16 days. The Association has registered to take part and have the opportunity of asking questions

As members will no doubt have 'heard 'activity at the airport improving, but the Airport company is lobbying for a change to the traffic light/isolation regulations in order for them to see significant improvement in activity. A review was due to be undertaken on the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ October but the Government has seen fit to review the Covid /isolation travel procedures during the latter part of September, which should result in a substantial increase in air traffic over the coming weeks.





BOOK REVIEW

THEN WE TAKE BERLIN

A spy thriller by John Lawton

As with most spy stories, this is a tale of trust and betrayal, but with not a little humour thrown in.

Set principally in Berlin in 1963, there are substantial flashbacks to 1941 when John Holderness, usually known as Wilderness moves in with his Grandfather following the death of his mother. Grandfather is cat burglar of some experience and Wilderness joins him becoming a real east End cockney wide boy.

Wilderness now has to do National Service, not his cup of tea at all, being opposed to any sort of discipline and ends up in a military prison, from which he is 'rescued' by his earlier CO, Colonel Burne-Jones. Burne-Jones, now in MI6 has him posted to Berlin where he meets up with Frank Spoleto and two helpers, one being Yuri an NKVD major, who are running a substantial black market scam and where he also meets Nell a native Berliner, with an interesting past.

In 1963, now down and out he meets up again with Frank who persuades him to return to Berlin and join him and the old team now smuggling people over the border. There is a lot of historical research woven into this story, which moves at quite a pace, with a number of twists and turns and if this is your kind of genre, you will enjoy.

I found it quite a good read.

HISTORY SNIPPETS. "Cat in a Barn"

The name Catherine de Barnes is a bit of a mystery. It probably comes from the Ketelburn family who were tenants of the land in the 12th Century.

However, Pete Peters tells the story in his book 'Catherine de Barnes, Past and Present' of it being called 'Cat in a Barn' and he reminded me of it the other day.

When a Canal Surveyor came out to map the line of the Grand Union Canal through this area in 1793, he would have asked locals the name of the hamlet. This was recorded, as he had heard it, as 'Cat in a Barn'! The name continued to be used by some of the old boatmen until the 1940's.

INGREDIENTS

CARROT, SWEET POTATOES AND FETA FITTERS

- 800g carrots
- 2 large potatoes
- 1 large onion
- 600g sweet potatoes
- 5 medium free-range eggs
- 200g feta, crumbled
- 6 tbsp wholemeal flour
- 25g fresh coriander, chopped
- 2 tbsp cumin seeds
- 300ml vegetable oil
- Green salad, lime wedges
- Yogurt to serve



METHOD

- Peel and grate the carrots, potatoes, onion and sweet potatoes. Put in a colander over the sink with a big pinch of salt to drain for 30 minutes.
- In a large bowl, combine the eggs, feta, flour, coriander and cumin seeds, then beat with a fork until mixed.
- Squeeze as much liquid from the veg as you can, pressing down hard into the colander for 1-2 minutes, then add to the egg mixture. Stir to combine and season well. Heat the oven to 150°C/fan130°C/gas 2. Heat the oil in a wok or saucepan to 180°C or until a cube of bread sizzles. Put a small handful of the mix in a slotted spoon and lower into the oil. Cook 2-3 at a time: fry for 1-2 minutes, then turn and repeat until golden. Put on a plate and keep warm in a low oven.
