HAMPTON VILLAGE FESTIVAL 2022 - WHAT A SUCCESS!

One month on and we're reflecting on what many of you have said was the 'best festival yet'. Despite the rain during the day, you came and supported the stallholders and raised lots of money for our local businesses, groups and clubs. It was great to see our local school musicians on stage, Theatretrain's lovely performance and the Dog Show so well attended. Thank you!

Once the evening arrived, and the sun came out, our festival kicked up a level! With several young groups performing early on, followed by Soul Matters, the 700+ of you certainly got into the festival spirit and, once our headline act '2 Week's Notice' got going there was no stopping you! They put on a fabulous two hour musical set, culminating in a wonderful firework display to round out the 2022 Hampton in Arden Festival.

Whilst the final total isn't vet in, we raised approximately £6,500, which will be fed back into the village and used to support local causes/ groups (further details to come).

QUEENS BATON RELAY

In the lead up to the start of the Commonwealth Games, the Queen's baton has travelled all over the Commonwealth and on Tuesday 26th of July, we were very honoured to have it travel through Hampton-in-Arden and stop at the Sports Club for the relay team to have lunch.

The Sports Club committee had organised a full day of events to allow people to sample many of the sports we are lucky enough to have available in the village. There were drop in tennis, boules, football and hockey sessions, cricket nets, mini track races on the field and England Squash had provided a perspex squash court which was assembled



in the car park. We are very grateful to the History Society who put together a display of the history of sport in Hampton, to Emma from Sandwiches at No. 6 who provided food and refreshments, to the Hampton Gym who provided a warm up and stretch session and to the pupils of George Fentham School who put together a display of Commonwealth art. The afternoon ended with live music from local band Off the Hook.

We hope that as well as creating an enjoyable event, we have been able to raise awareness of the sports available right here in the heart of Hampton and given people of all ages the chance to try a sport that perhaps they haven't tried before. CATHERINE DE BARNES PLAYGROUND - COMING SOON!

A new playground is to be installed in Catherine-de-Barnes, within the grounds of the Catherine-de-Barnes Village Hall. Solicitors are currently drawing up a lease for the Parish Council to control the area of land where the playground is to be located and we are awaiting quotations in order that the final financial arrangements can be resolved. All being well, it is hoped that the playground equipment will be ordered in September for installation in the spring of 2023. Watch this space!

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - 13TH NOVEMBER 2022

An early reminder that this year's Remembrance Day service and procession will be on Sunday 13th November. As with previous events the **High Street will be closed to through traffic between 10.30am and 12.00 noon** to allow the procession from the church to the War Memorial to proceed safely.

Marshalls will be deployed to control traffic. If any residents would like to volunteer to be a marshall on the day then please contact the Parish Clerk.

UNDER 7'S PLAY AREA AT THE RECREATION GROUND - WE NEED YOUR THOUGHTS!

The Parish Council are considering providing 'all-weather' surfacing to the Under 7 Play Area at the Sports Ground. The area is currently grassed between the swings and slides, and becomes very wet and muddy after wet weather. The proposal is to replace the whole grassed area with an all-weather surface that will avoid future damage and wear and tear from inclement weather and will allow use throughout the year. The approximate cost is estimated to be around £20k.

Do you think this project should proceed? Will it benefit the community? Do you think the costs are reasonable/too high? These are the type of questions we are discussing. We would like to seek resident's views before proceeding further.

MOBILE WARM HUB COMMUNITY CAFÉ

Did you make it to the Community Cafés held in Catherine-de-Barnes and Hampton-in-Arden? WRCC run the Warm Hubs project and Mobile Warm Hub community cafes in Warwickshire and Solihull. They are working hard to target social isolation and loneliness in rural and semi-rural communities, as well as providing support and advice on energy efficiency and keeping warm and safe at home.



Over the past few months, they have held mobile Warm Hub community cafes in the Parish and we have been very grateful to have them. Unfortunately, these events have now come to an end (for the moment at least). **We would like to say a big thank you to WRCC for provide such an excellent service.**

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY FUNDS USED TO BUY FESTIVAL MARQUEE

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge levied by Solihull Council on new development in the borough. Up to 25% of the sums raised in this Parish are returned to the Parish Council for disbursement.

Hampton Parish Council received CIL funds as a result of the development on the old Cricket pitch off Lapwing Drive, and much of this has been spent or earmarked for schemes such as traffic calming and enhancements to community and school facilities.

Most recently we have used CIL funds to enable the Hampton Festival Committee to purchase a new Marquee, which came in really useful at this year's Festival. Other recent CIL purchases have included additional dining furniture for the George Fentham School.

If you have a proposal which you feel might qualify for CIL support funding you should check our website and if it might be eligible submit an email with outline details to the Parish Clerk.

GEORGE FENTHAM TRUST UPDATE

● In late August/early September we will be undertaking some work to thin the trees in the Shadowbrook woodland area. The wood was planted over 15 years ago by the Trust on farmland beyond Shadow Brook and bordering onto the railway line. Since the planting it has become rather dense and needs to be thinned. As part of the process, the pathways will be widened and any dangerous trees will be removed. There are some areas of Ash which have unfortunately suffered from Ash Dieback – these



will be removed and the area replanted. There will be signs up to warn any walkers of the areas being worked on and hopefully this work will ensure the woods can thrive and be enjoyed for years to come.

- Our elderly support worker, Eve Hickman, and our wonderful volunteers put on a celebratory Jubilee themed afternoon tea for our OAP Lunch Club in May which was enjoyed by all that attended. **The Lunch Club is open to village residents and runs every other Wednesday from 10.30am with tea or coffee and biscuits, time to socialise followed by a home-cooked two course meal and entertainment.** Due to the success of the Lunch Club, we now run a coffee morning on the Wednesday where tea or coffee is served with cake or scones. Desserts and cakes are all home baked by village volunteers on a rota. Transport can be provided where needed. Please get in touch if you are aware of anyone in Hamptonin-Arden who would benefit from the Lunch Club or if you would be willing to go on the rota to make a cake or dessert.
- During June we interviewed a number of students from the village who will receive a grant from us to assist with their studies in Further Education. The Parish Council recognises the gravity of the climate change emergency and - in support of the Solihull Council Climate Change Emergency Statement - has now set up a Climate and Nature Emergency Committee. Through this committee we will seek to minimise the environmental impacts of our activities and investigate how we can contribute to the improvement of the wider environment through local action.



As a first step, the lighting columns at the Recreation Ground have all been converted to LED bulbs, thus helping to reduce the amount of electricity used.
