#### Airport Update-Night Flying Review

The working group met with representatives of the Airport's review group on the 14<sup>th</sup> May to discuss the proposals that had been put forward a few days before. As a result of the discussion, it was agreed that the working group would meet separately in an effort to come to a common understanding that could be presented at the next meeting with the Airport. The working group meeting has been arranged for 29<sup>th</sup> May. Unfortunately, due to the commercially sensitive nature of the data being discussed we are unable to greater detail at this stage but will do as soon as we are able. The items being discussed included nighttime noise levels, number of flight departures at night at various times, types of aircraft able to fly at night and the defining regime for breaching any agreed regulations.

#### Traffic Calming in Catherine de Barnes

We have been successful in receiving funding from National Highways for the traffic calming proposals and the RA organised an open village meeting in the Village Hall on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May commencing 7.30pm. This will probably be the last opportunity for villagers to comment on the proposals. The meeting will be attended by our Parish Councillors and hopefully a representative of SMBC Highways.

#### Planning and Neighbourhood Plan Update

#### No new planning news

Following a meeting with SMBC the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group have decided to progress the review by amending the draft document in order that it is likely to conform to the Emerging Local Plan (currently stalled) and the adopted Local Plan dated 2013. A revised plan document is currently being prepared which will be submitted to SMBC for an informal opinion and based on the results, the process of getting a new NP adopted will continue.

#### Village Hall Update

Unfortunately, the heavy rains we have experienced recently, resulted in significant damage to the outside toilet exposing issues with the flat roof. A leaking cistern was also discovered resulting in a very wet building. Quotes are currently being obtained for the necessary repairs which will also include the rendering of the building. Costs in the region of £10k are expected. In addition, the Trustees have applied to National Highways Social Fund for £9600 for new kitchen units and equipment plus their installation. (The fund has a £10k limit) The project will include re decoration of the kitchen which will be needed to be funded separately. Both the Residents Association and the Trustees believe the refurbishing of the kitchen is important and

feel that if we are unsuccessful in securing funding for the project it will be jointly funded by both organisations.

- Sending out communications which may be of interest to residents
- Liaised with Trustees over possible refurbishment of the kitchen in the Village Hall,

#### Next Hampton in Arden Parish Council Meeting



## **BOOK REVIEW** by JOHN ALDERSON

#### THE PROTOCOL An adventure novel by J Robert Kennedy



Professor James Acton (a regular Kennedy protagonist), is on an archeological dig in Peru where he has discovered a beautiful crystal skull, an artefact he has not seen before and of which he has no knowledge.

Suddenly and without warning his camp site is surrounded by members of the elite Delta Force (his own military) who treat Acton and his student staff as terrorists, killing all but Aston who is working in a cave at the time of the attack and managers to escape and make it to England with his new found scull.

He now finds he is being pursued not only by Delta Force but members of a twothousand-year-old society called the Triarii, who appear to be found in all walks of life and whose raison d'être is to guard and protect these sculls, as he finds there are more of them.

He meets and teams up with Laura, a fellow archeologist and the story of what happens next is the story of this novel.

This moves along at great pace as the Delta people seem to have access technologically to everyone and everywhere, which his quite frightening in a way as this military unit actually exists in the American Military.

Not a bad story, quite a bit of violence, definitely one for the conspiracy theorists.


#### WELCOME PACK FOR NEW RESIDENTS
