## Planning News

#### PL2024/01198/PPFL. New 9 bedroom dwelling at Heath Farm, Henwood Lane

The Association has had sight of the response to this application by the Parish Council and has written objecting to it on the grounds of the size and mass of the new development and its impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

## **National Planning Policy Framework**

Perhaps sooner than expected details of the potential changes to this framework are now in the public domain for consultation. The review amongst other matters covers changes to house building in the Green/grey belt and how local authorities will be required to deal with housing numbers. These changes could possibly affect the current **Parish Neighbourhood Plan Review** and members of the working group are due to meet with SMBC officers later this month to establish if and how the review could be affected.

## Airport Matters-Night Flying Review (NFR)

For the past 15 or so months the NFR working group, which we participate in, have been in dialogue with Airport representatives discussing possible changes to the now expired current policy. The discussions include night time noise levels, numbers of a movements and uses of various types of aircraft at night. The Airport's final proposals will be presented to the Airport Consultative Committee on the 5<sup>th</sup> September. The Airport Company will then present them to SMBC who will be asked to approve them as part of the S106 conditions, and a new Night Flying Policy application from October for the next 3 years. As a result of these discussions it has been agreed that a Noise Working Group will now be a permanent entity constantly monitoring all elements of the new policy, rather than the ad hoc group formed just to deal with a review. We will report on the base elements of the new policy pay next month.

## Village Hall Update

Kitchen refurb- following information from National Highways (NH) some months ago, we were advised that our application for a £10k grant for the hall kitchen refurbishment would go before their grant committee back in June. Then we were told it would be September, but recently we were notified that representatives from NH wanted to discuss the application further. Arrangements have now been made to meet with them mid= August so we should be able to give you more news next month - let's hope it's positive news. Fingers crossed. Outbuilding tidy up – thanks to those who turned up on the 18<sup>th</sup> to go through the contents of the 3 outbuildings at the rear of the hall. Unfortunately, most of the contents were riddled with woodworm and beyond saving and destined for the skip.

The Play Area- we have received confirmation from ROSPA that the Annual Inspection of the play equipment will take place in September.

Following the very successful tidy up earlier this year and taking up the numerous suggestions we should do another later in the year a "Tidy Up Event" has been arranged for **Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September at 10 am meeting at the Village Hall** to pick up the equipment being provided by SMBC. Rich will be missed by many in the village for his warm nature, always the comedian, a much loved person, husband and father.



# Catherine de Barnes History



# **BOOK REVIEW** by JOHN ALDERSON

# LAST CALL at the HOTEL IMPERIAL

A book by Deborah Cohen



This is not a novel, it's a true story of a group of five American reporters covering the events of the world largely between the two World Wars. Their names, now largely forgotten are John and Frances Gunther, Dorothy Thompson, H R "Knick" Knickerbocker and Vincent "Jimmy" Sheean.

Their stories are of ambitious reporters sometimes working for national Newspapers or Radio or sometimes freelance rushing from one hotspot to another, reporting from London, Berlin, Addis Ababa, Shanghai, Delhi, Jerusalem and Barcelona. These are a highly intelligent fast paced group, promiscuous hard drinking reporters with incredible contacts to world leaders but with complex home lives and very normal gentle sides to their personalities.

The rise of Hitler and Mussolini and the inevitable march to WW 11, figure prominently and it is very interesting to observe the American view of this period of time through the eyes of people who were telling the story to an initially unresponsive nation.

Deborah Cohen tells the stories beautifully, capturing the louche world of Europe between the wars and the frantic pace at which these people moved around, anxious to inform the world and America in particular, of how they saw the gathering storm.

This is a big book, 500 pages of small print paperback, but I found it easy and fascinating read and recommend it to anyone with an interest in this period of history
