Planning News

PL/2025/00547/MAJFDW Outline planning for the demolition of Mell Square site and full planning application for redevelopment of Phase 1.

Of interest may be the plans to redevelopment the site adjacent to Morrisons car park. In brief the development consists of 1 block 13 m high the other 3 a t 9-10m. The blocks contain 346 apartments of various sizes, with parking provision for only 60 cars, (1 disabled space) and 120 cycle racks. Although the official response date has passed you are still able to comment and we encourage you to do so Stakeholder responses to the application can be viewed using the following link Simple Search and entering 0547 in the Keyword box.

Airport News

The Airport has a £76 million infrastructure development plan with significant improvements to many of its facilities eg toilets and washrooms, baggage handling and security. They have handled over 13million passengers in the last financial year with a target of just under 14 million for this year. Following recent lowering of noise limits at least 1 airline has changed its procedures so as to avoid exceeding those limits and the subsequent fines for breaching the limits. As a member of the Noise Group we will continue to press for noise reduction, a night time quiet period and a reduction in night time movements

Village Hall

We will shortly be obtaining quotes for roof repairs which were identified in a recent survey which has been paid for by funds from the Parish Council Community Infrastructure Levy Fund. The outbuilding has been repainted and plans are afoot to install a small PA system in the hall complete with a remotely controlled video screen.

The hall will revert to a Church again for Remembrance Sunday on the 9th November .

We are currently looking at options as to how to fit a pre lit Christmas tree or Christmas tree affect in the grounds – more news in later editions.


Berry Hall (continued)

BIRMINGHAM MAIL, 2ND JANUARY 1939

The Trustees of William Albert Upton sold the Berry Hall Estate – comprising Berry Hall, Old Berry Hall and about 136 acres – on 8th June 1939 for £37,000. The purchaser was Mr Harold Arnold Tippetts, chairman and joint managing director of L. H. Newton & Co., nut, bolt and screw manufacturers, of Nechells, Birmingham.

Tippetts family

The *Warwick County News* of 17th June 1939 reported that Mr Tippetts, of Four Oaks, Sutton Coldfield, had fallen in love with the gardens at Berry Hall and so resolved to buy the entire estate. He apparently out-bid a prominent Solihull businessman in the last round of the auction. The newspaper noted the new owner's intention to modernise Berry Hall considerably, with the installation of electric light everywhere being the principal improvement.




