Sherbourne - Materials Recycling Facility

What can I recycle? All items should be clean and free of food



All plastic bags

carrier bags
salad/fruit/vegetable bags
frozen food bags
bread bags
cereal bags
flower bags



Confectionary wrappers

chocolate
sweets
biscuits
cakes
ice cream and chewing gum wrappers



Foil lined packaging

crisp/snack packets
coffee bags



Cheese, fish, and meat wrapping



Outer layer bags and wrapping

multipacks
toilet and kitchen roll
magazine and newspaper wrapping



Plastic film and sleeves

removeable film lids
plastic sleeves for bottles and jars



Bubble wrap and cling film

maximum 1m sections



Fruit and vegetable net bags

Sherbourne - Materials Recycling Facility

- >61% brown bin waste recycled
- Do not recycle items <2 inches or <5 cm in diameter
- Food pouches and polystyrene cannot be recycled
