26/53 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE AGM HELD 16 JULY 2025

26/54 MATTERS ARISING

26/11 Overgrown Vegetation: This remains an ongoing issue with several areas in the Parish being followed up with the Public Realm department at Solihull Council.

incurring the substantial costs quoted by Severn Trent Water.

Cllr Cook confirmed that National Highways had now issued a new digital booklet detailing the road closures and works being undertaken in the vicinity. The clerk confirmed she would circulate this online.

26/58 FEEDBACK FROM THE RIGHTS OF WAY AND FOOTWAY REPRESENTATIVE

Cllr Waring referred to his detailed report and clarified that the Parish Council does have authority to carry out improvement works within the Parish. He emphasised that this does not alter Solihull Council's responsibility to maintain the land within its remit.

Members had no further comments for Cllr Waring.

26/59 FEEDBACK FROM CIL COMMITTEE

Cllr Green referred to his circulated report and advised that the Committee would be convened shortly to review several recent applications. He noted that some of these may require further guidance from full council, which would be sought in due course.

It was further noted that additional members for the Committee would be welcomed.

26/60 FEEDBACK FROM THE COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

Cllr Sellars referred to the Minutes circulated from the recent committee meeting. No comments were raised upon the same.

26/61 FEEDBACK FROM THE PLANNING COMMITTEE

In Cllr Cuthbert's absence the clerk referred to the planning report contained within the report pack. The chair highlighted the following issues:

01404 Woodhouse Farm, Catherine de Barnes: The Parish Council have objections to this application and will be submitting a response in due course.

01572 Old Station Road: The Parish Council have arranged a village meeting that is to take place on 03/10/2025 at the Fentham Hall at 6:30pm. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss with residents the various planning issues that the Parish faces and the ways in which we can work together to protect it. The Parish Council have obtained an extension until 13/10/2025 and will be submitting a response following the upcoming village meeting. It was noted that Saqib Bhatti MP and Ward Councillors Sleigh and Rolf will attend that meeting.

The Parish Council had now received a revised application in on Ashtree Grove and would be considering that further in due course.

Cllr Cook noted that Oak Farm had recently been approved but it was understood that various issues were raised and therefore a watching brief will be maintained on that application.

The chair noted that whilst not in our Parish, it should be noted that the outcome of the Chestnuts Farm appeal had now been received with 5 appeals being considered separately. Further information regarding the outcome of those appeals is located within the attached report pack with parts being allowed and others dismissed. The farm has a period in which to comply with the appeal outcomes.

26/62 FEEDBACK FROM THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN WORKING GROUP Cllr Green reported that the Neighbourhood Plan comprises three elements: the draft Neighbourhood Plan, the Basic Conditions Statement, and the Consultative Statement. He advised that Solihull Council has now formally accepted both the Consultative Statement and the Basic Conditions, and the next step is to finalise the draft Neighbourhood Plan. A watching brief will be maintained to gather any further information before the Neighbourhood Plan is submitted.

26/63 FEEDBACK FROM THE GREENER HAMPTON AND CATNEY WORKING GROUP

The group had nothing to report at present. Jane Humprey's had organised a successful visit to Sherborne Recycling Centre with several residents attending that visit. Juliet Main is in the process of arranging meetings with parish organisations and further updates will be available at the next Parish Council meeting.

The chair thanked both Jane and Juliet for all their hard work in this working group.

26/64 PARISH COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES – THE GEORGE FENTHAM TRUST

The chair noted that the Parish Council appoints 3 representatives to The George Fentham Trust. In recent times Greg Lakin had resigned from that position and more recently he had also resigned from his position as both Vice-Chair and Trustee. The Trust are therefore advertising for two vacant positions. The Parish Council have requested sight of any applicants, prior to interviews taking place.

26/65 SOLIHULL COUNCIL STREETCARE – UPDATE TO MEMBERS

The chair wished to update members that Solihull MBC's streetcare department have notified the clerk that pavement sweeps will now take place on a "request only basis". This system relies on residents notifying Solihull MBC who will then undertake an inspection before agreeing whether to undertake the sweep.

26/66 ROAD CLOSURES (SOLIHULL ROAD AND CATHERINE DE BARNES

Both Solihull Road and Catherine de Barnes Lane will close from 22 September 2025 until 23 January 2026 to enable remedial works to the steel bridge to be undertaken. The Parish Council understands that Solihull Road will reopen over the Festive Period but no clarification on the exact dates has been provided.

The Parish Council have raised residents' concerns over this closure directly with National Highways.

CCTV - THE CORNER SHOP 26/67

The chair noted that quotes in the region of £4,000 had now been obtained and confirmation of authority to proceed offered by the owner of the Corner Shop and its tenant. Members were reminded that a decision on whether to proceed had not yet been agreed and it was therefore proposed by Cllr Clayson to proceed with the installation of CCTV in this vicinity. Cllr Reid seconded this proposal with all members being in favour.

Cllrs Clayson and Reid will now proceed to draft a formal application to the CIL AC/PR Committee for funding.

26/68 REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY PLANNING

Cllr Sandells was not present at the meeting. The clerk will follow up with him about the necessary road closure paperwork. The clerk confirmed that a PA system had been hired for the event and Central Fast Response booked to attend to support.

The clerk would arrange for the Tommy to be erected, contact marshals, arrange for road closure signs to go out and organise village organisation wreaths.

HAMPTON IN ARDEN SOCIETY'S SHOWCASE EVENT 26/69

26/70 REPORTS FROM OTHER MEETINGS

Cllr Waring reported on a recent Public Rights of Way meeting with Paul Tovey of Highways, Solihull MBC. Discussions included the condition and replacement costs of boardwalks, with some concern expressed about the way forward. It was noted that the Packhorse Bridge is weakened on both sides, and that an attractive stone rebuild could be a potential option for the future.

Cllr Cook confirmed that the next meeting with Skanska would take place on 06/10/2025.

The clerk referred members to the financial report circulated in advance.

Payments for the last 2 months were authorised by the Chairman in accordance with the Parish Council's Financial Regulations.

Members received the outcome of the Audit undertaken by Moore UK with a copy

Parish Councillor Vacancy Recommendation to appoint John Ainsworth

Following Cllr Mike Blomer's decision to step down from the Council, we currently have a vacancy that we need to fill.

As this is a mid-term vacancy, and following an uncontested election for the post, the current councillors can co-opt a replacement with the person appointed serving until the end term of our current period of office in May 2027.

The vacancy was therefore advertised and whilst we received 3 applications one applicant decided to withdraw for personal reasons before interviews could take place.

The remaining two applicants were Jane Humpreys, who many of you will already know as she is a member of our Greener Hampton and Catney Working Group, and John Ainsworth.

By coincidence both have a science/medical background and are both retired and so have time to commit to becoming active members.

The Chair and Vice-Chairman recently met with both applicants for an informal discussion/interview and whilst they were both great candidates, they have agreed they would like to recommend to members the appointment of John Ainswiorth.

The reason for choosing John over Jane was that they felt Jane was already doing an excellent job with the Greener Hampton and Catney Working Group and further felt the PC would benefit more if Jane stayed focused on this until it was more established.

They also felt John had the time, inquisitive nature as well as an interest in matters around conservations, planning and the airport that would be of great benefit to the PC.

Members are provided with both applicant's personal statements (under separate cover) and are asked to consider the above information provided by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman to the Parish Council.

Members are reminded that even though a preference has been expressed, the formal decision to co-opt must be made by a majority vote of members present and a vote will be undertaken during the Parish Council Meeting.

Once the vote has been concluded and a resolution passed, the successful candidate, if present, can sign a Declaration of Office and take a seat as an appointed Parish Councillor.

Members are asked to consider the proposal put to them by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman during the Parish Council Meeting on Wednesday 19 November 2025.

Wards

The vacancy is for the Hampton in Arden Ward.

The Parish Council have been advised by the Monitoring Officer that to change members between wards they would need to resign from their position which could ultimately trigger an election.

The intention is therefore to appoint John to the Hampton in Aden Ward until the expiry of the current term in May 2027.

26/17 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE ABOVE MEETING

26/05 Goal Posts New goal posts have now been purchased; Trevor Honeysett has been asked to build and secure them as well as remove the old one that remains.

25/30 Village Signage Board (Train Station) The clerk now has a proposed draft for approval. It will be circulated to members for any comments. The clerk is investigating the best way of proceeding with installation via London Northwestern.

26/18 THE COMMON AND THE DELL, CATHERINE DE BARNES

Cllr Eccleston confirmed that the end of season cut was due to be undertaken shortly but there were no concerns to report.

26/19 HAMPTON IN ARDEN CHURCHYARD

The clerk noted overhanging vegetation from the churchyard impacting the footpath and would notify the church so that they could arrange for this to be cutback.

26/20 STATION IMPROVEMENTS, VILLAGE SIGNAGE AND PLANTER MAINTENANCE

The Committee noted the comments made regarding village signage in 25/30 above. No further reports regarding planter maintenance.

26/21 RECREATIONAL GROUND, SPINNEY, AND VILLAGE GREEN

Sports Club/Recreational Ground

GH confirmed that the hedge had recently been cut, and all was in order.

Discussions are ongoing regarding the installation of a storage container next to the existing green shed to house the Conservation Group's equipment. A quote is awaited from Dawsons Groundcare to prepare the base and install the container. GH explained that he is speaking with a contact who may be able to provide a container and will update the Committee in due course.

Costs for purchase and installation were looking to be in the region of £2,500.

The Spinney

The Conservation Group continue to do an excellent job of maintaining The Spinney. A working group led by Michael Abbott is also doing an excellent job of creating and maintaining footpaths within it.

Village Green

The War Memorial has had a full clean and been repointed in readiness for Remembrance Sunday. The area will have a full footpath and road sweep, and Clir Sandells has asked Dawsons to strim the Green the weekend before also. *Tommy* has now been put in place.

Christmas Light Switch on Event

The switch on event will take place on Friday 5 December. The clerk has asked Ebner Consultants to provide a quote for additional lights to be attached to our current offering.

26/22 SCOUT & GUIDE HUT

The chair confirmed that Solar Panels are now in place.

Trevor Honeysett has put a temporary fence in place where an existing gate had been but the posts had rotted and is no longer needed with a more permanent solution due to be done shortly.

26/23 FENTHAM ROAD AND EASTCOTE LANE COMMUNITY ALLOTMENTS

The Committee noted the comments regarding the water supply at the Fentham Road Community Allotments in 26/10 above.

The clerk raised a concern regarding a plot holder at Eastcote Lane Community Allotments who had failed to properly cultivate their plot in accordance with the Contract. It was agreed that the Committee would write to the plot holder highlighting the concerns and asking that, should they wish to continue, they provide a breakdown of their plans for the next growing season.

Cllr Sandells provided an overview of the recent Play Area Inspection that had been undertaken by RoSPA. Several advisories were noted for action, the majority of which could be referred to Trevor Honeysett. The clerk will check that Trevor has capacity and action.

26/25 ROADS AND FOOTPATHS

Cllr Sandells noted overhanding hedges on Old Station Road that require cutting back. The chairman requested he send a photograph to the clerk so she could action.

Major Infrastructure Working Group

The Major Infrastructure Working Group meets regularly with both Solihull MBC and representatives from National Highways, Skanska and HS2. Members of the Group also attend Meriden Quarry Liaison meetings and meet with any interested residents who may have concerns about issues that directly affect them.

Updates for November Parish Council Meeting 19 November 2025

HS₂

The recent HS2 exhibition in the Fentham Hall gave details of the construction programmes for the major structures in or close to the parish. Of particular concern is the on-going construction of the River Blythe Viaduct that crosses Meriden Road. Construction of the viaduct piers close to Meriden Road is under way and is expected to be complete early in the new year. The next activity will be to crane in the precast concrete beams for the viaduct over Meriden Road. At a meeting between the group and Paul Tovey of Solihull MBC on 9/10, it was confirmed that this work would require some overnight closures.

Speed Cameras in Hampton in Arden

The group are awaiting data from Solihull MBC/Solihull Police so that it can be relayed to residents. The Parish Council have been notified that the Average Speed Cameras are proving effective and that several fines have been issued.

Overhanging Vegetation within the Parish

The group continues to highlight several areas that require substantial works being undertaken to tackle overgrown vegetation. Following a period of significant communication, works were recently undertaken on Marsh Lane and Solihull Road.

There remains an issue with overgrown vegetation affecting several streetlights and the group are continuing to work with Solihull Council on this issue.

Parking in Hampton in Arden

Cllrs from the group recently met with the Hampton in Arden Parking Group. Further details of that will fall under reports from other meetings. The Parish Council are subsequently in the process of arranging a meeting with interested parties to facilitate discussion regarding practical ways in which to tackle the ongoing concerns related to parking in the vicinity of Soho Tavern and Fentham Hall.

Following a detailed Parish consultation and subsequent Traffic Regulation Order legal consultation undertaken by Solihull MBC, initial measures to implement yellow lines have been agreed and engineers from Solihull MBC have marked up those locations within Hampton in Arden. The scheme will go live on 12 January 2026.

The Parish Council does have a copy of resident responses to the recent consultation. Residents were firmly against double yellow lines being implemented in Hampton in Arden in the locations that were suggested, particularly on Marsh Lane. Whilst the Parish Council can seek Ward Cllr support to proceed and install double yellow lines on Marsh Lane within a 2-year timeframe period, they have been urged against doing so by both Solihull MBC and Ward Cllrs until initial measures have been introduced and analysed further.

TRO Parking Consultation

Following lengthy discussion with Solihull MBC, the group can confirm that a TRO Consultation is planned for Catherine de Barnes. Members are asked under a separate Agenda item to consider the proposed plans before returning to Solihull MBC with confirmation of their view.

The group proposes that the plan be accepted and Solihull MBC be given the Parish Council's support to proceed with the consultation.

Build out on Hampton Lane

The group has been involved in discussions with Solihull MBC for some time regarding various concerns linked to the build out on Hampton Lane in Catherine de Barnes. The Parish Council have received several complaints from residents and have been alerted to several collisions at the location.

At a recent meeting with Paul Tovey, Head of Highways at Solihull MBC, it was agreed that reflective paint would be installed and lighting in the vicinity would be increased to enhance visibility. That work has not yet taken place and a request to Solihull MBC seeking timeframes has been issued.

The Parish Council wrote to Highways on 7/11 seeking their support in considering further steps, for example, moving speed signs further up Hampton Lane, installing a speed hump adjacent to the gateway, further improving lighting and cutting back any overgrown vegetation. A response is awaited.

M42 Junction 6

Catherine de Barnes Lane Bridge has now been reopened to traffic.

Traffic management measures remain in effect on the A4545 northbound, and the Solihull Road Bridge continues to be closed until the New Year. A brief period of Solihull Road will take place during the Christmas period: 19 December 2025 to 5 January 2026.

Some concern has been raised by residents at the lack of work seemingly being undertaken. The group raised these concerns directly with National Highways and received a programme of works from them. Members may wish to consider whether it would be appropriate to write further to National Highways.

Clls from the group attend regular meetings with Skanska and have been informed that the Rights of way clearance inside the DCO will commence around the middle of November (including footpath from Dogs Home roundabout) and that those works will be finished by the end of year.

Cllrs are next due to meet with Skanska on 17/11. A verbal update will therefore be provided at the Parish Council meeting.

Hi Julie

Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding Hampton Lane and for forwarding the Parish Council's comments relating to highway safety in this area.

Further to your discussion with Paul on 14 October 2025, I can confirm that the proposed reflective road marking works consist of reflective lining on the build out kerbs to make it more visible. I do not have a date, however these works will be undertaken in line with contractor availability, and the exact implementation date will be confirmed once the programme has been finalised.

With regard to the additional points raised:

- 1. Relocation of speed signs The current sign positions have been installed in accordance with national traffic sign regulations and Department for Transport guidance. The build out and related signage have been constructed at the terminal point where the speed of the road changes from 40mph to 30mph. Under the statutory and regulatory requirements, the terminal sign must be located where the speed changes. The gateway feature is illuminated by a street lamp column and is clearly visible to drivers travelling in both directions along Hampton Lane. Relocating them further along Hampton Lane would not provide any additional road safety benefit and may reduce their effectiveness for approaching drivers.
- 2. **Installation of a speed hump adjacent to the gateway** The current traffic calming measures are considered proportionate to local conditions. The introduction of a further vertical feature such as a speed hump may reduce speeds further along this stretch but may also increase the level of noise that Mr Roach comments on below.
- 3. **Improving lighting in the area** Street lighting along Hampton Lane has been reviewed as part of the original design. The lighting is considered adequate for the type of semi-rural location. Additional lighting is not proposed at this stage.
- 4. **Vegetation clearance** Routine inspections are undertaken to ensure visibility is maintained. Any overgrown vegetation affecting sight lines will continue to be addressed as part of the regular maintenance schedule.

I am also aware of the recent accident that was reported to us by the Parish Council. Whilst we are unaware of the contributing factors of the accident that has occurred, driver behaviour can be a factor especially if the driver ignores the priority over oncoming traffic and races through the gateway.

When we make such changes to the highway layout, we need to balance a number of factors with the aim of reducing vehicle speeds travelling through the village.

I appreciate the Parish Council's continued interest in improving road safety. While we recognise the concerns raised, the measures currently in place are considered appropriate for the location, and no further alterations are planned beyond the reflective road markings.

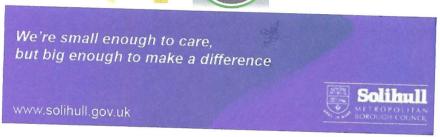

Public Rights of Way report for November 2025

M42 affected paths.

The date for reopening of M122 and M123 is now confirmed as November 2025.

I have inspected both and can see that completion is imminent.

I met with Highways representatives on 28th October to discuss access from Shadowbrook Lane.

The date for opening of other connected paths is expected to be January 2026.

PRoW review September 2025.

I have submitted an application to the CIL Sub-committee to fund improvements as detailed in my recent survey of parish PRoW. The proposal is to replace all stiles within the parish either with kissing gates, or the removal of stiles completely.

I understand that this application has been approved, subject to limitations.

I ask for support on this project. I shall provide full details, including a draft letter to occupiers and landowners affected.

The improvements suggested are of an upgrade nature rather than maintenance, and therefore fall outside of SMBC's legal responsibilities. I have the support of SMBC Highways Dept.

Commentary

- Padel Tennis Since the last meeting we have rejected the application for £75,000 to part fund new Padel Tennis Courts at the Sports Club.
- Kissing Gates The CIL Committee have recommended the award of £10,350 + VAT to fund the installation of six kissing gates on footpaths within the Parish. The proposal, put forward by Roger Waring, is intended to eliminate some of the more challenging stiles, and to replace them with user friendly kissing gates, thus encouraging the use of these routes by walkers. As the existing stiles are not deemed a health & safety risk, their replacement would not be funded by SMBC, as they represent an improvement. In terms of size of award this payment lies within the CIL committee's delegated powers to approve. However, as the Parish Council has not hitherto spent any CIL resources on footpath improvements, it is felt the full PC should be asked to confirm their agreement in principle.

- Oak Farm £300k.
- Lugtrout North £170K
- Old Station Road £400k

The challenge remains the unpredictable nature and timing of the CIL funding.

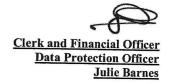

Hampton PC Meeting November 2025

Neighbourhood Plan update.

Our Draft Neighbourhood Plan and all its associated documents and appendices have been submitted to SMBC for a **Regulation 16 Consultation**.

SMBC have confirmed that they are satisfied that the relevant statutory and legal requirements for the submission have been met. The Regulation 16 Consultation therefore went live for a period of 6 weeks from Friday 7th November 2025 until 5pm Friday 19th December 2025. If it clears these hurdles it will go to independent examination.

Hampton-in-Arden Parish Council Report

1. Green Homes

Our recent talk to the Hampton-in-Arden Society went very well. Lesley has asked for the link to the Green Doors webinar on Thursday, and I am forwarding Phil's link so that it can be added to the Parish website.

As a result of the Society meeting, one householder attended Saturday's Green Doors event, and two local residents have now signed up for Solihull MBC's 'Solar Together' scheme.

Following the most recent event, David Chapman (Green Homes Lead for SMBC) recorded a short video interview with me, which we hope to circulate soon.

Two Green Doors events have been held at our home — on Friday 24 October and Saturday 8 November. David is planning a presentation for all residents in March 2026 at Fentham Hall.

2. Medicine Blister Pack Recycling

The empty medicine blister pack recycling initiative has been revitalised both at the Pharmacy and through the Surgery (via messages from prescribers). I now deliver a large carrier bag of empty packs each week to Boots, who forward them to TerraCycle — an organisation that has already recycled over 75 million blister packs.

Please note that St Mary's Pharmacy will accept empty blister packs for recycling even if they did not originally dispense the medicines.

3. Greener Hampton & Catney Working Group

Juliet has created a Facebook page for the Greener Hampton & Catney Working Group and designed an attractive logo. I've provided her with photographs from the Green Doors events to feature on the page.

4. Repair Cafés

We now have a second local Repair Café. The inaugural event at St John's Church Hall, Knowle, took place on 1 November. It appears to be run through Knowle Parish Church, and I am currently finding out the date of their next session.

We have received positive feedback on this idea from our engagement to date, and believe it will have a positive impact for residents and local groups, in terms of health and well-being as well as for

This should also support the Parish Council's 'Biodiversity Duties' under the 2021 Environment Act.

Proposed principles for the LNAP

- 1. Focus on engaging and collaborating with existing village groups, local businesses and key nature charities such as Warwickshire Wildlife Trust and the Canal & Rivers Trust. Amplify and connect what is already being done.
- 2. Involve as many residents as we can prioritise actions that will appeal to different groups including young people and younger families.
- Be pragmatic. Only propose activities if we know how they will be funded, and who will move

A proposed three-year LNAP 2026 - 2029

Year 1 - prepare the ground

- Gather as much baseline data on the species and habitats, and potential areas of restoration as
- Engage as many local organisations as we can.
- Run a calendar of simple activities to grow visibility.
- Use available channels (chronicle, newsletters, meetings, websites, village events, Social Media)

Year 2 - quick wins

Deliver one or two projects that have support, funding (if needed), and complement what others are already doing. Gather records of activities,

Year 3 – aim higher

Think about establishing corridors or stepping stones, bigger scale rewilding with landowners, working with the Wildlife Trust on habitat recovery.

Next steps

Plan (8-10 pages) to be drafted up and shared ahead of March 2026 meeting for approval by the PC, and publication on website by April.

A request has been made to the Warwickshire Biological Records Office who will provide recorded data for the Parish free of charge. Other more comprehensive data sources such as the Wildlife Trust have a cost associated so have not been progressed at the moment. Purchase of data layers is one possible expense identified related to this plan. For now it's being done based on free data.

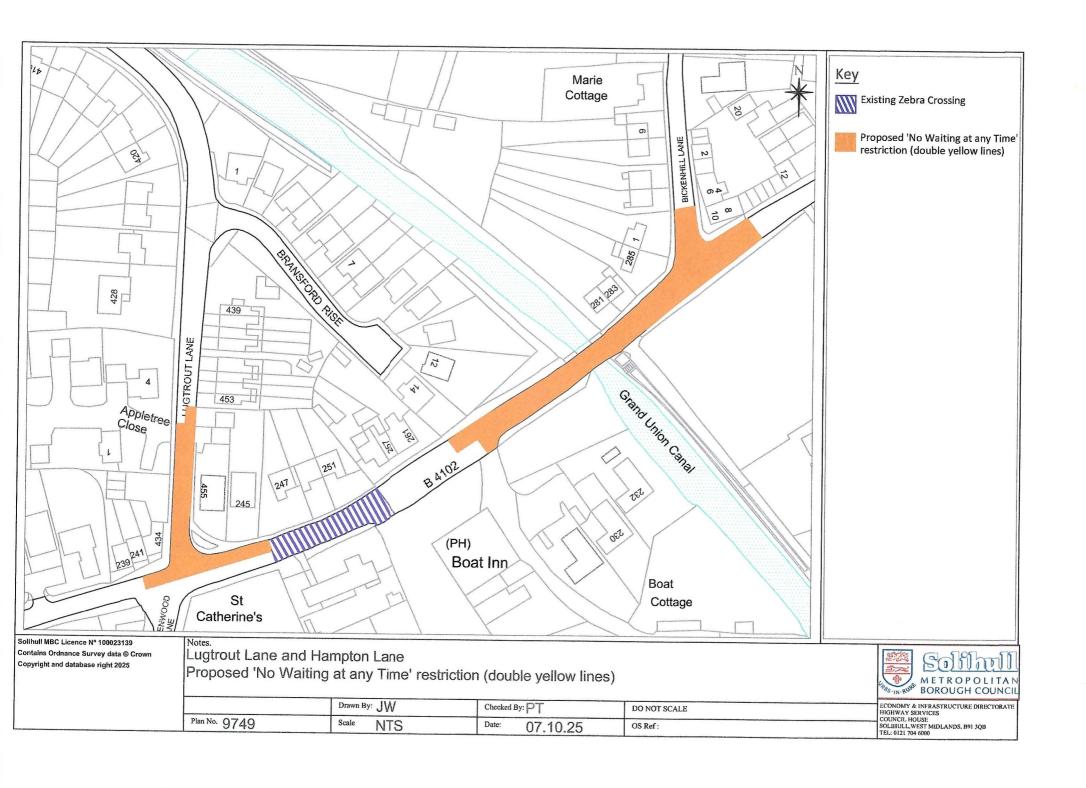

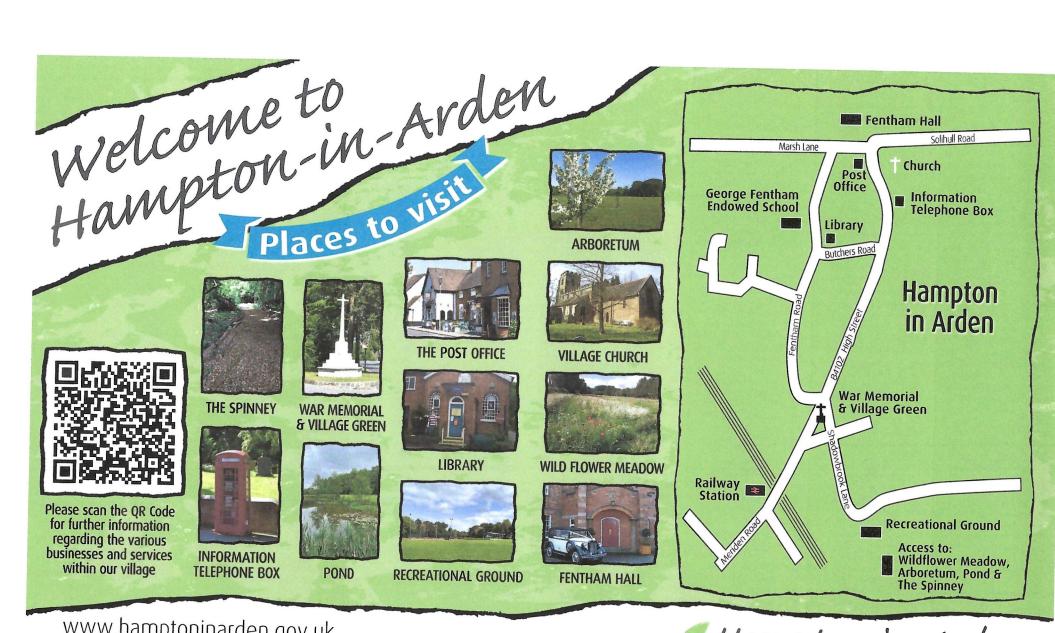

Parish Council Reports from Other Meetings

Meeting held in the Arden Room on 07/11/2025 at 9:30am with Ward Councillors R Sleigh and A Rolf. Parish Councillors in attendance: Cllrs Cook, Cuthbert and Eccleston.

A meeting was held between Cllrs Cook, Cuthbert, and Eccleston and Ward Councillors A Rolf and B Sleigh to discuss potential funding streams to improve disabled access at Hampton in Arden Train Station.

During the meeting, Ward Cllrs and Parish Councillors acknowledged that Hampton in Arden Station is one of the very few railway stations in the West Midlands that currently lacks step-free or easy access facilities. Ward Cllrs confirmed that both Solihull Council and the West Midlands Rail Executive recognise this as a priority issue.

It was agreed that the Parish Council, alongside Solihull Council, should continue to pursue all relevant funding opportunities, including:

- The Great British Railways "Access for All" programme, and
- City Region Sustainable Transport Settlement (CRSTS) funding streams.

Ward ClIrs confirmed that there is broad support within Solihull MBC for improvements to accessibility at Hampton in Arden Station, and that funding for this project should be treated as a priority. It was also noted that this issue is well known across the borough and should continue to be promoted whenever relevant opportunities arise.

Following this discussion, Ward Councillors recommended that the Parish Council write formally to:

- Kenneth Hawkins, West Midlands Railway Executive, and
- David Balme, Chief Transport Planner, Solihull MBC

requesting their support for funding applications and project prioritisation.

In addition, it was recommended that a separate letter be sent to Ed Cox, Interim Chief Executive of the West Midlands Combined Authority (WMCA), requesting the Authority's support for the installation of disabled access at Hampton in Arden Station.

Finally, the Parish Council will also respond to Mr. Robin Etherington, a local resident who has been a long-standing campaigner for improved accessibility at the station and who has recently written to the Parish Council.
